Ciano Shines in Tullamore Sunshine

The Centenary of the schools athletics championships were celebrated in glorious sunshine in Tullamore with an action packed programme that started at 9.00 and drew to a close at 6.00 The club had 9 athletes representing seven different secondary schools. Ciara Harrington was 9th in the discus with a throw of 21.86 representing the Presentation college, Coady Tunstead representing the Vocational school was 9th also in the shot with a putt of 10.94, Sarah Graham representing St. Leo's was 12th in the javelin with a throw of 20.69 Nicole Kehoe/Dowling also from St. Leo's was 5th in the discus with a throw of 30.38 (despite her injured ankle) and7th in the shot with 9.85 Gerard Kelly was 7th in the hammer with a P.B. of 36.54 meters in the Knockbeg colours. Daena Kealy representing Borris vocational cleared 1.60 once again to claim the bronze. It was bronze also for Ruby Millet in the long jump equalling her P.B. with a leap of 5.58 meters in the Kilkenny college colours. Caragh Maher representing Gaelchloiste Ceatharlach had an excellent battling performance to take the bronze in the 800 in a new P.B. of 2-19.84 (the hard work paying off). With the heat at its sweltering best the distance events were difficult to say the least. This didn't deter Cian Kelly who sat in nicely in the pack until it picked up over the last 3 laps in the 3000. With two laps to go it was obvious the Knockbeg singlet was going to be on the podium the question being which place. Putting his foot on the pedal Ciano eased himself into the lead and fair to say came home a comfortable winner of the gold, for his first All-Ireland schools title. Well done all round and hopefully you had enough sunblock for a great day.

Follow up just as good

The next day Sunday it was back to Tullamore basking in the glorious conditions where the Leinster senior and masters championships were down for decision. The club had 15 athletes in action. Tom Barry registered 12.43 in the 100 and 7.35 in the shot for 6th. Jamie Pender was 5th in the 100 in 11.37 and 4th in the 200 in 23.17, Katie Brennan was9th in the 200 in 28.50 while Shauna Daly was 8th in the 200 in 27.74 and claimed the silver medal in the 100 in 13.45 Emma Daly was 4th in the hammer with 38.74 and 2nd in the weight for distance throwing 6.86 Clare Delaney took the pole vault title with a new P.B. of 2.70 meters. Conor Daly was 2nd in the T.J. with 12.95 and 3rd in the P.V. with 3.40 Eoghan Buggy had a fine run for silver in the 400 in 50.75 seconds. The masters men were out in force in the 5000 and delivered in style with Stephen Hunter completing the double in the 0.35 just getting up in the final strides to take the 1500. John Fenlon ran an excellent race in the 5K to win the O.40 and lead the club members' home. Colm Burke added the O.50 title to his medal list while Francis Fleming underlined his current great form to take the O.60 title. Equally impressive and making great strides at the moment Colin Coyne took the silver in the O.35 John Territt moved into the O.55 status and duly delivered taking 4 titles which included two championship best performances these included 1st Discus 30.32, 1st Javelin 34.03, 1st hammer 35.06 and 1st shot 9.72 As in the previous week it was Saragh Buggy who turned in the five star performance finishing 2nd in the L.J. with 5.64 and increasing her National record in the triple jump moving it out to 12.89 meters.

She was joined by club mate Caitriona McDonald who ran 3-47.34 in 310th place.
