It was gold also for the B.U.10 with Daragh and Dara, Jonah Kelly 10th and Adam Buggy 12th scoring and supported by Shane Buggy, Peter Grogan, Lee Murray, Tom Hay and Adam Doyle. The G.U.14 were also victorious with Cara, Orla, Ruby Millet 5th and Orla Kelly 7th scoring with Aideen Barry having a fine run also. Cian and Tom led the U.14 boys to victory with Jonathon Crossley 8th and Niall Egan 12th while Gerard Kelly, Daragh McDonald and Ross Bolger wearing the colours.
